- Goal:** The overarching goal is to reduce the incidence and mortality rates of cervical cancer in Houston and the surrounding area. The summit will bring together university and school-based nurses, health professionals from community clinics and academic settings, and local community and political leaders to discuss cervical cancer prevention and treatment; review evidence-based practices; and to build a more coordinated approach to reducing cervical cancer.

Aims:

The aims are to:

- Raise awareness of HPV vaccinations for both females and males;
- Raise awareness of cervical cancer screening and treatment;
- Identify barriers and resources to help underserved and uninsured women receive needed diagnostic services and/or treatment for cervical cancer as well as help establish a medical home; and
- Establish a navigation system for women needing an HPV / PAP / cervical cancer triage in the greater Houston area.
